- Curtin University
- Edith Cowan University (ECU)
- Murdoch University
- The University of Western Australia

TISC receives and processes applications for admission to these universities. TISC doesn't select applicants, assess qualifications or decide eligibility for admission - the universities do this. If you want detailed information about a course or want to check the likelihood of selection, you should ask the Admissions Centre of the university offering that course.

It is relevant only for admission in 2020 and is subject to change without notice. In particular, the universities reserve the right to change the content and/or the method of presentation and/or the method of assessment of any unit of study, to withdraw any unit of study or program which they offer, to impose limitations on enrolment in any unit or program, and/or to vary arrangements for any program.

PAYMENT OF APPLICATION PROCESSING FEE

TISC won't activate your online application until you've paid for it. You won't be able to see or use the other online options (like changing preferences) until your application is paid for.

You can pay the application processing fee online at the time of application, or send it/bring it in to TISC.

Make cheques and money orders payable to TISC. TISC accepts MasterCard/Visa - use the authority form on your Application Coversheet (generated after you declare). Don't send cash by mail. You must pay in Australian dollars.

TISC doesn't refund fees.

APPLYING TO UNIVERSITY

✓ HOW DO I APPLY THROUGH TISC?

Apply via TISOnline, TISC's online application system at www.tisc.edu.au.

But first you need to do some research:

- Read the sections on pages 6-12, which tell you how the preference system works and how offers are made.
- Check the course descriptions and admission requirements of courses you're interested in on TISC's website. Note any prerequisites and specific requirements.
- Check pages 14-33 for Course Codes and other information which you'll need to apply.
- Read each university's section.
- Contact the universities to find out more about specific courses. The contact details of Western Australian universities are in the university sections of this Guide and on TISC's website.
- Check closing dates on page 2.
- Check costs on page 3.
- Check the information about scholarships on TISC's website.

⚠ Remember:

- The information in this Guide and on TISC's website is very important for your application. Go through it carefully before lodging your application, as TISC and the universities will assume you have read all relevant sections.
- Upload any documentation requested by your application coversheet (see page 13) to your TISC application.
- Note any extra course-related submissions you need to make (eg portfolio, personal statement, etc). These are specified in the relevant course information, but are not requested by your application coversheet.
- Keep your Guide. You may want to refer to it between now and January.
- Check the TISC website regularly for new, amended and withdrawn courses.
- Check your emails regularly (including your **junk mail** folder) in case TISC has contacted you about your application.
- **Don't use your school email address** when applying through TISC as you may not be able to access this email address once you've completed your Year 12 studies.

WHO SHOULD APPLY THROUGH TISC?

You can only apply through TISC if you're an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or you've been approved or granted Australian permanent resident status.

If you're applying for permanent residence, you **aren't eligible to apply through TISC** until your permanent residence status has been **approved or granted**. Contact the respective universities for advice.

NOTE: If you have a subclass **457 visa**, you aren't eligible to apply through TISC. You must apply direct to the relevant university(ies).

You must provide correct details of your current residency status when you apply. If an offer is made to you, and university checks find that you've provided incorrect residency status information, the university concerned will withdraw your offer in accordance with its policies and procedures.

AUDITIONS AND PORTFOLIOS

Are you applying for:

- WA Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA) courses,
- Other ECU courses that require an audition and/or interview, or
- UWA's Music Studies, Music General Studies or Specialist Music Studies majors?

If so, you need to apply through TISC **and** submit a separate application for audition/interview direct to the institution concerned (ECU and/or UWA). More details are in the course information on TISC's website.

For Curtin: If you're applying for the Portfolio Entry pathway, apply through TISC and submit your portfolio directly to Curtin University. For more information regarding Portfolio Entry Pathway, please refer to curtin.edu/portfolio-entry.

For ECU: If you're a School Leaver who will obtain an ATAR, you must apply through TISC. You can also prepare an Experience Based Entry Scheme application as a backup. To be considered through the Experience Based Entry Scheme pathway, in addition to your TISC application, you will need to complete an online application with ECU and upload your supporting documents to your application (ecuworldready.com.au/apply).

If you won't obtain an ATAR you should apply direct to ECU and upload your supporting documents to your application (ecuworldready.com.au/apply). You do not need to apply through TISC.

For Murdoch: If you're a Portfolio applicant, apply through TISC. However, submit your portfolio online via <https://portfolio.murdoch.edu.au>.

APPLYING TO ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

Applications for courses offered by Associate Members are not lodged through TISC. Apply to the institution direct (contact details on inside back cover of this Guide and on TISC's website).

RELEASE OF SCALED SCORES AND ATAR

You access only your scaled scores and ATAR from TISC's website – www.tisc.edu.au.

You access your WACE results via the School Curriculum and Standards Authority website – www.scsa.wa.edu.au.

APPLYING INTERSTATE

To apply to universities in other Australian states, submit an application through that state's Tertiary Admission Centre (organisations like TISC in each state). As it will be a separate application to your TISC application, with a separate list of course preferences, you may receive offers from more than one state.

The Commonwealth Government's Course Seeker website (www.coursesseeker.edu.au) allows you to search and compare courses from across the country. It's a really useful resource.

MY APPLICATION

CHOOSING AND CHANGING PREFERENCES

How Many Courses Can I Choose?

You can choose up to six courses. List them in order of preference, starting with the course you'd most like to study. You should list more than one preference, especially if a similar course is offered at more than one university. Choose what you'd really like to study, but be realistic in your choices. If you're not sure whether you meet the requirements for entry to a course, check with the relevant university's Future Students team.

Does the Order of My Preferences Matter?

Yes, it does matter. You only receive one offer. Your first preference should be the course you'd most like to study, your second preference the course you'd next prefer to do, and so on up to six preferences. List only courses for which you'd accept an offer. You'll be made an offer for the preference highest on your list for which you're eligible, as long as a place is available.

Are All Preferences Given Equal Consideration?

Yes. Our system is designed to offer you the highest preference possible. If you're not selected for your first preference, you'll be considered equally with all other eligible applicants for your second preference, and so on. Your chance of being selected for a particular course isn't reduced because you've placed that course as a lower preference. Have a look at the Year 12 presentation on our website which goes into this in detail.

Can I Change My Preferences?

Yes, at any time, subject to closing dates. You can change some or all of your preferences at any one time. Changing your preferences cancels all previous preferences.

You'll have two full days after Year 12 results are released to change your preferences for the December offer round. We strongly recommend that you give serious thought to your preferences before then, to avoid making a rushed decision. There will also be plenty of time between the December and January offer rounds to review and reconsider your preferences if you wish.

Can I Change My Preferences Between the December and January Rounds of Offers?

Yes, subject to closing dates, and **as long as you don't accept or defer your December offer**. Make sure that you understand the implications of changing preferences at this stage. Read the 'Offers' section which follows. Don't change preferences until one of the universities or TISC notifies you whether an offer has been made.

Closing Dates for Changing Preferences

Check the dates on page 2 to see whether any course you want to add has an early closing date. Closing dates aren't negotiable – **TISC cannot give you an extension.**

✔ How Do I Change Preferences?

Via TISOnline – go to www.tisc.edu.au and log in to your application. **Changing preferences is a three-step process, which involves moving through three pages online** – make sure that you go through all three steps and receive a reference number, then you'll know you've successfully completed the change. It costs nothing to change your preferences.

Will TISC Confirm My Changes of Preference?

Once you've changed your preferences online, you'll see a page confirming the changes you've made and providing a reference number, which you can print if you like. You can log in at any time to check your preferences, but make sure that you're viewing your **current committed preferences**, rather than those in your Course Folder or those which are still uncommitted.

i Where Can I Get Advice?

If you don't understand the procedure involved, or if you're unsure whether or not to change preferences, contact TISC or the Admissions Centre at one of the universities **before you do anything at all – in particular before you accept or defer your offer.**

METHOD OF STUDY

Full-Time Studies

If you choose 'Full-time' as your method of study, you'll study a full-time load of units and enrol in classes on campus for whenever the unit is timetabled. This may be in the daytime or the evening. Some units may be offered in more than one timeslot. Full-time is indicated by 'F' in the tables on pages 17-33.

Part-Time Studies

You can study many courses part-time. Part-time means undertaking a lesser load of study than the normal full-time load. If you're a part-time student, you'll study a part-time load of units on campus. You'll enrol for classes on campus for whenever the unit is timetabled. This may be in the daytime or the evening. Some units may be offered in more than one timeslot. Courses available by part-time study are listed with method of study 'P' on pages 17-33.

External Studies

If you're an external (off-campus) student, you won't normally attend classes on campus. Course materials will be mailed to you or made available online. Some courses may be offered either partially or fully online. External study is available for some courses at Curtin University, Edith Cowan University and Murdoch University (method of study 'E' – see pages 17-33). External study isn't available at The University of Western Australia.

Curtin Online Studies

Some Curtin courses are delivered either partially or fully online. If you're an external student, you won't attend classes on campus. Course materials are available online and you'll learn using a wide variety of sources that can include interactive videos and animations, simulations, online workgroups, etc. You're required to have internet access for Online Studies. Online Studies courses are listed on pages 19-20 and marked with the superscripts 8 (fully online), 9 (partially online) and/or 10 (limited assistance available at Country Centres).

ECU Online Studies

To study online with ECU, select 'E' as your method of study. Internet access is required for all external study at ECU.

Can I Change My Method of Study After I Get an Offer?

You'll need to discuss this with the university when you enrol.

✔ HOW DO I START MY APPLICATION?

- You must be registered with TISOnline to be able to log in, lodge an application to university and access other online functions. Some users are registered automatically, while others need to self-register as new users. To get started, go to the Registration Status Check page for information on your 8-digit User ID and password required for logging in to TISOnline.
- Note that any User ID allocated to you in previous years is not valid anymore.

I'VE DONE MY APPLICATION – WHAT NOW?

- Your application is considered for admission only after you have paid the application fee. When you complete the declaration step, your application is locked, awaiting fee payment to TISC. There are time limits related to the acceptance of payments. Your coversheet will advise you of the deadline.
- Make sure you read your coversheet.** Your coversheet will tell you about any documentation that you need to upload in support of your application, and TISC will email you about any extra submissions you need to make which aren't listed on your coversheet. There's lots of guidance on submitting documents on page 13.
- Once the payment has been processed you'll be able to change your preferences and your contact details if necessary. Any other information can't be changed. If you have forgotten to add something or made an error, submit the changes in writing to TISC. You will find an Application Changes Form on TISC's website.
- TISC is under no obligation to accept payment of applications if received after the required date. Applications that have not been paid for are considered invalid and will not be included in university offers.

WILL TISC ACKNOWLEDGE MY APPLICATION?

Print your **application coversheet** as a record that you've applied, **and as a reminder to upload the documents, if any, requested on it.** Once you've applied and TISC has processed your payment, TISC will send you an email confirmation, so you'll know your application is live.

WHAT'S MY TISC APPLICATION NUMBER?

Your TISC application number is recorded at the top of your application coversheet, and is the same as your eight-digit WACE candidate number if you're a 2019 Year 12 student taking WACE courses or courses endorsed by the School Curriculum and Standards Authority. If you're a 2019 final year IB student, you must register on TISC's website before applying (see the IB brochure at www.tisc.edu.au for details of this). If you're a 2019 final year student at a non-standard school in WA, you must register on TISC's website before applying (see *Applicants for Admission from Non-Standard Schools* on page 8).

✓ I NEED TO CHANGE MY ADDRESS/ EMAIL ADDRESS

Let TISC know in writing, by telephone or online, if you change your address or your email address, because otherwise you may not receive important information about your application. See page 2 for the change of address/email address deadline before offers are made.

Make sure you also ask your school to let the School Curriculum and Standards Authority know your new address.

EMAILS AND YOUR JUNK MAIL FOLDER

TISC will use email to contact you throughout the admissions cycle (August through to February), so do check your emails regularly (including your junk mail), particularly leading up to the December and January offer rounds. Provide an email address which will be active throughout this period (ie **NOT your school email address**, which you may not be able to access after graduation). Save the email address which TISC will use to contact you (**applications@tisc.edu.au**) as an approved sender so that emails from TISC don't go to your junk mailbox. TISC will assume that you've read its email notifications and requests, so if there is a problem with the email address you supply, it may affect the outcome of your application. Plus, **any offer of a place will be emailed to you**, so a viable email address is essential.

PHONE NUMBER

Provide a home, work or mobile phone number in Australia which will be current during the period August to February. TISC and the universities may telephone you if the matter is urgent.

⚠ FRAUDULENT APPLICATIONS

When you apply, you declare that your application is 'true and complete'. If your coversheet tells you to, you must upload documentary proof of all previous Year 12 (or equivalent), and post-secondary studies, including failed courses or units. It's a serious offence to submit a false declaration or false documents. If you do, TISC will notify all participating universities, and your application may be withdrawn. Some universities have policies in place which will prevent you being offered a place in subsequent years. Past cases have also been referred to the police. If you're offered a place in a course and your application is later found to have been incomplete or misleading, your enrolment can be terminated and your academic record annotated accordingly.

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Refer to the Admissions Requirements brochure for 2020 on TISC's website. Also see the Prerequisites and Specific Requirements sections of the courses you're interested in on TISC's website.

Applicants for Admission from Non-Standard Schools

Apply for admission via TISC, but also include with your application a statement giving full details of your upper secondary school studies. WACE isn't required by any of the universities for applicants from non-standard schools.

SPECIAL TERTIARY ADMISSIONS TEST

What is the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)?

STAT is a nationally recognised set of tests offered by TISC to help mature age candidates gain entry to university. STAT doesn't test knowledge of specific academic subjects, but tests a range of competencies considered important for success in university study, such as the ability to understand and think critically about issues. As a result, you don't need any particular preparation to sit STAT.

STAT is also used as a second-chance test of English competence. If you don't achieve English Language Competency via your WACE exam but have sat the exams in English ATAR, Literature ATAR or English as an Additional Language or Dialect ATAR, you may be invited to sit STAT in late December/early January to demonstrate English Language Competency for university entrance. This invitation will be on your Universities Admission Advice Letter (UAAL), which will also provide your ATAR and scaled scores from ATAR courses. If your UAAL doesn't invite you to sit STAT at Year 12 results time, but you've sat exams in one of the above English courses, you may also sit STAT to achieve English Language Competency. In this case, it would be wise to check with the universities whether English Language Competency is all that is required to give you eligibility for university entry. See TISC's website for information on STAT and how to book a test, but note that you can't book until after the WACE examinations. If you took English/Literature/English as an Additional Language or Dialect General, you'll need special written permission from a university before you can book for STAT.

OFFERS

WHO MAKES THE OFFERS?

The individual universities make the offers of admission. After any of the offer rounds, if you have any queries about why you have or haven't been made a particular offer, contact the Admissions Centre of the university concerned.

HOW ARE THE OFFERS MADE?

Your application is considered on the basis of selection criteria established by each university. You're ranked in order of merit for each course you've listed. Most universities take into account any or all of the following when considering your application:

- secondary studies, and
- post-secondary studies, and,
- in some cases, special circumstances (see universities' entries, pages 34-60).

The offer process will consider your first preference first, and if it's possible to offer you that, will do so. If it's not possible to offer you your highest preference, the system will ignore that preference and try to offer you your next preference. This process continues until we can make you an offer, or until all your preferences have been considered. If an offer is made, any preference lower than the offer preference is ignored. See scenario examples in the Year 12 presentation on our website, which explain this further. You can view your offer via TISC's website. The university concerned will advise you of the offer details by email and/or mail, including information on how to respond to the offer.

WHAT IS A SELECTION RANK?

For most courses, you'll be selected for admission on the basis of your ATAR (for IB students, a conversion to a Combined Rank or Selection Rank). However, some universities assign WACE students who are eligible for other entry pathways a Selection Rank which is higher than their ATAR. For these students, selection into courses is based on the Selection Rank assigned by the university concerned.

Eligibility for the entry pathways is based on specified criteria. International WACE students are not eligible for these pathways. TISC advises eligible WACE students at the time of the WACE results/ATAR release in December, via the Universities Admission Advice Letter (UAAL). The appropriate Selection Rank is automatically applied for offer rounds. For 2020 admission, the following pathways provide Selection Ranks for eligible WACE students: Curtin University's StepUp Entry Pathway, ECU's ECU Access Pathway, Murdoch University's RISE Pathway, and UWA's Broadway UWA Pathway. For further details about any of these pathways, see the individual universities' sections in this Guide or the university's website.

WHEN WILL I GET MY OFFER?

December offers will be available to view on the TISC website on Monday 23 December.

Emailed and/or mailed details of an offer will be sent by the universities over the following few days. If you haven't received written notification of your success in the December round by Tuesday 24 December, contact the university concerned.

January offers will be available to view on the TISC website from Thursday 16 January, with email and/or mail details sent out by the universities shortly afterwards.

January offers will be made to eligible new applicants, previously unoffered applicants who are now eligible (including those who sat STAT to satisfy university English requirements), those who changed preferences since the December round, and those applying for some quota courses where the majority of offers are made in January.



HOW MANY OFFERS WILL I GET?

Generally, only one offer, if any, in each of the offer rounds in December and January. If you receive an offer in both the December and January rounds of offers, the January round offer supersedes the December round offer. You can't have both.

WHAT ARE GUARANTEED ATARS/SELECTION RANKS?

The universities have listed Guaranteed ATARs/Selection Ranks for most of their courses. If you achieve the Guaranteed ATAR/Selection Rank specified for a course on your preference list (and also achieve English Competency and any other prerequisites of the course), you're guaranteed to be eligible for an offer in that course. The offer you receive in the offer rounds will depend on your preference order. Guaranteed ATARs/Selection Ranks are included with the Course Codes for 2020 admission on pages 17-33 of this Guide and also on TISC's website. Some courses don't have Guaranteed ATARs/Selection Ranks listed, as they have a strictly limited number of places available and/or have extra admission criteria, like UCAT, audition, interview, etc.

WHAT OTHER ATAR INFORMATION IS AVAILABLE?

The Minimum ATAR/Selection Rank and Guaranteed ATAR/Selection Rank information in this Guide show you what will be required for entry into courses in 2020.

On the TISC website, you will find further details for each course that shows information from offers made in 2019:

- the lowest ATAR (excluding any adjustments) and Selection Rank (including adjustments) to receive an offer in 2019; and
- the maximum ATAR and Selection Rank to receive an offer in 2019; and
- the median (middle) ATAR and Selection Rank to receive an offer in 2019.

The Selection Rank information is probably the most helpful guide for you. This includes any adjustment factors added to students' ATARs. These can be for a variety of reasons. See the universities' sections in this guide for details. For 2019 WACE students, Selection Ranks for each of the TISC member universities will be printed on your Universities Admission Advice Letter, as well as your raw ATAR.

✔ I'VE GOT A DECEMBER ROUND OFFER! WHAT DO I DO NEXT?

Check the options below, or the diagram on page 11, for what to do next.

😊 You've been made an offer you're happy with and you're ready to start!

Accept the offer, following the university's instructions in your offer email. There'll be a deadline in your offer email, so make sure you accept in time. You won't be made any other offers.

😊 You've been made an offer you're happy with but you'd like to take a break before you start.

Apply to defer your place. There'll be information about what is possible and a deadline in your offer email, so make sure you act in time. You won't be made any other offers.

😞 You've been made an offer and you're not quite sure now whether that's what you really want.

If you're offered your first preference:

Use the TISC 'automatic safety net'. **Don't accept or defer your offer now. Move your first preference offer to a lower position** on your

preference list and try for an offer in a higher preference in the January round. You don't need to contact the university. **This change of preferences saves your offer.** When the January round offers are made, you'll either get an offer for a higher preference course or your saved December round offer again. A new offer cancels the previous offer – you can't hold two offers at the same time. You won't get an offer for a preference listed lower than your saved December round offer.

If you're offered your second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth preference:

Use the TISC 'automatic safety net'. **Don't accept or defer your offer now.** You can either:

- Do nothing at all and hope to get a higher preference offer in January round; or
- Move the offered course to a lower position on your preference list and try for an offer in a higher preference. You don't need to contact the university.

Either way, your offer is saved and, when January round offers are made, you'll either get an offer for a higher preference course or your saved December round offer again. A new offer cancels the previous round offer – you can't hold two offers at the same time. You won't get an offer for a preference listed lower than your saved December round offer.

😞 You've been made an offer but you've totally changed your mind about what you want to do.

To reject the offer, change your preferences and remove the offered preference from your preference list. You'll lose the offer, but you'll be reconsidered in the January round. Most courses will continue to take students who meet the minimum entry requirements.

⚠ If you've been offered your first preference and you don't do anything, the university will withdraw your offer and you won't be considered for any other offers.

📌 Contact TISC if you make errors in changing your preferences after the December offer round, or are unsure about what to do. We can help you.

✔ I DIDN'T GET A DECEMBER OFFER – WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS?

If you didn't receive a December round offer, don't panic. Here are your options:

You can:

- Do nothing and automatically be considered for the January round; or
- Change your preferences and be reconsidered for the January round.

If you hadn't satisfied entry requirements (such as English) before the December round, but have met the requirements since then (eg by achieving the required score in the second chance English test (STAT)), you'll automatically be considered for an offer in the January round.

If you don't know why you didn't get a December offer, you really should contact the university Admission Centre(s) to receive advice on your eligibility and the best pathway for you into the course/s of your choice. Their advice will be invaluable to you.

Let TISC know if you no longer wish to be considered for any course at any university in the January round and we'll withdraw your application. There's no refund of application fee if you withdraw your application.

I'VE GOT A DECEMBER ROUND OFFER – WHAT DO I DO NOW?



JANUARY ROUND OFFERS

You'll be considered in the January round of offers, and may be made an offer if you:

- Hadn't satisfied entry requirements (eg English) in time for the December round, but have since met the requirements; or
- Changed your preferences between Monday 23 December and Wednesday 8 January, inclusive; or
- Received an offer in the December round and elected to save that offer to the January round (automatic safety net); or
- Applied too late to be considered in the December round; or
- Didn't receive an offer in the December round and didn't advise TISC to withdraw your application.

You'll either be:

- Made an offer if you have met course entry requirements since the December round; or
- Offered a preference higher than your saved December round offer; or
- Re-offered your saved December round offer; or
- Made an offer, even if unsuccessful in the December round of offers; or
- Advised that your application was unsuccessful.

✔ I'VE BEEN MADE A JANUARY ROUND OFFER. WHAT DO I DO NOW?

Accept and enrol or defer your offer by the deadline in your offer email or you'll lose your offer. There aren't any further offer rounds.

ENROLMENTS AND DEFERRALS

✔ How Do I Enrol?

Your offer email will outline enrolment procedures. You'll have to enrol online or in person. **Note that you will need a Tax File Number (TFN) in order to apply for a HECS-HELP loan.**

Can I Defer?

Yes. You can defer your offer of a place for twelve to twenty-four months (depending on the university concerned), subject to certain restrictions and meeting the application deadlines.

You can defer all courses, with the exception of Music courses at The University of Western Australia, Nursing at Murdoch, and WAAPA, Nursing and Music Education courses at ECU.


For some courses, the universities also allow deferral for one semester if second semester entry is available for the course and there are places available. For further information, see the individual universities' sections in this Guide.

WHAT IF I'LL BE OVERSEAS/AWAY FROM HOME IN DECEMBER-FEBRUARY?

You need to make crucial decisions once TISC releases your Year 12 results, and a short time later when the universities make offers. The universities will provide details of their offers by email, so make sure that TISC has your current email address and that you check your emails **(including your junk mail)** around the published offer date. If you'll be away from your normal address during December-February, change your address with TISC or arrange for someone to check your mail for you, as some information may come by mail during this period.

If you haven't received your emailed December round details of offer from a university by 24 December, contact the university immediately.

If you want TISC or the universities to be able to discuss your application, offer or enrolment with someone other than you, you must provide written authority. Download the online authorisation form (printing three copies), fill in each form and send one to TISC. Give one form to the person you've nominated so they can present it if they need to contact TISC or the universities, and keep the remaining completed form for yourself.

 Follow the instructions detailed in your offer. It's possible to **lose an offer** in certain circumstances if you don't follow the instructions. See the diagram on page 11 for guidance on your options **before you respond to your offer**. If you're unsure of what to do, **contact TISC for assistance before you respond to your offer**.

After accepting your offer, and depending on the university, you must enrol online or in person. You may not be able to nominate someone else to enrol for you. Ensure that you're in Perth and can enrol on the specified date if you have to enrol in person.

AUSTRALIAN 2018 YEAR 12 RESULTS COMPARISON

An ATAR achieved from 2011 or later in any state or territory (except Queensland) is considered the same as an ATAR from any other state or territory (except Queensland).

For Queensland applicants, the Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) provides TISC with an equivalent ATAR. See TISC's website for the comparison table showing how state and territory ranks equated to Queensland Overall Positions in 2018. This table can be used as a broad guide to how 2019 ATARs and Overall Positions will equate.

Tertiary institutions throughout Australia agree that if an interstate Year 12 applicant has fulfilled the requirements for eligibility for selection into all courses in their home state, they are eligible for consideration for entry into courses in another state (subject to ATAR and any specific course requirements).

WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

WHAT ABOUT MY SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION?

✔ **TISC needs documentary proof of all qualifications and any change of name** you've stated on your application. TISC can obtain some of this proof electronically, but not all of it. If you need to provide any documentation, **your Application Coversheet will tell you**. If TISC isn't successful in retrieving the results it expects for you, we'll email you and ask you to provide the documentary proof yourself. Applications where information or documentation isn't complete may not be successful. It's your responsibility to provide all supporting documents, unless your Application Coversheet tells you otherwise.

If you have to upload documents, **you must comply with TISC's strict requirements for supporting documentation**:

- Documentation to support qualifications you've completed consists of **both an academic transcript** (subjects and grades you obtained, including failures, withdrawals and incomplete studies); **and separate proof of completion** (certificate, diploma).
- Documents must be **original, uncertified documents** which are **complete, in colour and clearly legible (not blurred). Copies, certified copies, online printouts, faxes and examination result slips aren't accepted for upload**. Note: In all cases TISC reserves the right to request an original document.

Studies in Second Semester 2019

If you're studying in Semester 2, 2019, apply to TISC by the closing date and upload all documents requested by your Application Coversheet, including results to date. Upload the documents for your Semester 2, 2019 study as soon as they're available. TISC and the universities can't guarantee that documents received at TISC after 13 December will be considered in the December round of offers, but they'll be considered for the January offer round.

Documentation which TISC will try to obtain for you

✔ **WA TAFE and Fremantle Education Centre studies**

TISC can obtain Semester 2, 2019 results for all WA TAFEs and Fremantle Education Centre (as long as you apply to TISC by 30 November 2019). WA TAFEs will only provide proof of course completion to TISC if you've applied to graduate. **You must apply to your WA TAFE for your award by the end of October 2019 if you expect to complete your qualification at the end of 2019**. If you don't do this, it may affect your application, as the universities require proof of course completion when assessing your qualifications.

International Baccalaureate results

TISC can retrieve 2019 International Baccalaureate results. If you're sitting The Diploma of the International Baccalaureate (IB) in 2019, arrange through your school in advance for your results to be made available to TISC. Provide your IB personal code so that TISC can retrieve your results.

IB results will be considered in the January offer round.

When you apply for university through TISC or register for the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) through TISC, we necessarily collect personal information about you. PAYING FOR UNIVERSITY STUDY

If you're a domestic student, check www.studyassist.gov.au/. Changes are likely to the current information while the Federal Budget 2019 is still subject to the passing of legislation. You should check the StudyAssist website at intervals during 2019 for any amendments.

Financial Assistance

If you're studying, you may be eligible for financial assistance. The Department of Human Services provides assistance to students through payments such as Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY and Austudy. Full details of payments are available at humanservices.gov.au.

Scholarships

All four universities offer a growing number of scholarships to assist students financially. WHAT IF I HAVE A DISABILITY, MEDICAL CONDITION OR LEARNING DIFFICULTY?

COURSE CODES – SOME TIPS

Use the codes in this section to apply for courses and change preferences. You can also find the codes – and important course information – using the Course Search function on the TISC website.

Make sure you read the course information on our website, so you get the full picture on entry requirements for your chosen courses.

Majors (specialisations) within degrees might have a specific course code, or might be listed with other majors under the name of the degree. If they're listed under the name of the degree, you'll be able to choose which major you want to do when you enrol at the university.

In some courses, you can choose to complete two majors (double major). Some popular combinations have been listed in the following pages, but there are many more combinations available. It pays to check with the university before you apply if you're interested in a particular major combination, as not all majors can be combined. To apply for a double major, just choose the code that includes one of the majors you're interested in. You can confirm the combination once you enrol at the university.

You only need to use a course code once in your preference list. (Our application system won't let you add it twice.) This is so you can keep the biggest range of options available.

Check codes carefully, as some courses are offered at more than one campus.

Some courses have specific subject prerequisites. Check the entry on TISC's Course Search for details.

All courses lead to a Bachelor degree, except where indicated.

GUARANTEED AND MINIMUM ATAR/ SELECTION RANKS

Minimum ATARs/Selection Ranks are provided for most courses. Minimum ATARs/Selection Ranks show you the rank needed to be considered for entry to a course. However, obtaining these ranks is not a guarantee of being selected for a place in these courses. Some courses will have N/A for the minimum ATAR/Selection Rank, where an ATAR is not applicable due to emphasis on other eligibility criteria.

Guaranteed ATARs/Selection Ranks are listed for many courses. If you achieve the Guaranteed ATAR/Selection Rank for a course, you are guaranteed acceptance into that course, provided you also achieve WACE, English Competency and a scaled score of 50 or more in the ATAR course prerequisites listed for the course.

Some courses have no Guaranteed ATAR/Selection Rank listed, as they use additional selection criteria (such as aptitude test, audition, interview, etc) and/or have limited places available.

You get a maximum of one offer at a time in each of the two major offer rounds. So, while you might be eligible to enter many courses on your list, the actual offer you receive will depend on your preference order. See our website for tips on how to structure your preferences.

If you're eligible for any university-specific adjustment factors (StepUp to Curtin, ECU Access, Murdoch RISE or Broadway UWA) you will have a Selection Rank which is higher than your ATAR. See www.tisc.edu.au for information on Selection Ranks.

For most courses, information on the lowest, highest and median (middle) ATARs and Selection Ranks offered places in 2019 is available on TISC's Course Search or university websites.

METHOD OF STUDY

Many courses offer either full-time (F) or part-time (P) enrolment, and may be studied on-campus or externally (E) (off-campus), including online. See page 7 for further information.

HOW DO I APPLY VIA TISCONLINE?

If you already have a User ID (your 2019 WACE candidate number) and a default password

1. Go straight to step 3

If you have no User ID

2. Register on TISOnline and receive User ID.
Set own password.
Don't register if you have User ID but have forgotten what it is – email info@tisc.edu.au for assistance.

Now you've reached step 3, complete all steps through to 11

3. Thoroughly check information
on www.tisc.edu.au

4. Login to online application system on www.tisc.edu.au, using User ID and password and start application, following prompts

5. Choose at least one preference
(university course)

6. Provide details of previous and current studies/qualifications

7. Declare application
(accept application conditions)

8. Choose payment option:

- Online with credit card
- By mail
- In person at TISC

9. Print coversheet and read it carefully

10. Pay application fee

11. Upload to your TISC application all supporting documentation requested on coversheet

Remember: You can stop part-way through your online application at any stage, save what you've done, and complete it another time, subject to closing dates.

Until the fee's paid, TISC won't activate your application.

Also, until the fee's paid, you can't access (or even see) a number of online menu items (including change of preferences).

Note: You'll need to log in to your application to access/see some online menu items.

ADMISSION CRITERIA

General admission criteria:

- An Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 70 or equivalent; and
- English Language proficiency (refer to curtin.edu/english-criteria for details)

Course specific criteria:

- Some courses require an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) above 70;
- Any course prerequisites and other essential requirements for a particular course (refer to course page).

Check the 'Admission Requirements for School Leavers 2020' on the TISC website.

There are a number of ways you can satisfy admission criteria. The University reserves the right to determine the appropriate equivalence. Although you may be eligible for admission to the University, this doesn't guarantee a place, particularly in courses for which there's competition for the number of places available.

If you have completed AQF Certificate IV qualifications, you must also satisfy Curtin University's English Language Proficiency.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

You must satisfy the University's English Language Proficiency for admission to Curtin University. You can demonstrate English Language Proficiency by achieving a scaled score of at least 50 in one of the following WACE courses: English ATAR, Literature ATAR or English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EALD) ATAR (for eligible students).

ADMISSION PATHWAY COURSES

UniReady Enabling Program

The UniReady Enabling Program is offered by Curtin Learning and Teaching and aims to develop independent learning skills in preparation for university-level study. It's a bridging course that facilitates your access to university by meeting the conditions of Curtin's minimum admission requirements. Please note, UniReady now incorporates the Enabling Course for Science, Engineering and Health and will now enable students to meet the entry requirements for a range of *Health, Humanities, Business and Science and *Engineering undergraduate courses. *Not direct access to all courses. Indigenous Tertiary Enabling Course (ITEC)

The Centre for Aboriginal Studies offers the ITEC, which is an enabling course designed to bridge Indigenous students into undergraduate degree programs. The broad aims of the course are to develop the knowledge and competencies required by Indigenous people to access and complete undergraduate degree programs.

Indigenous Pre-Medicine and Health Science Enabling Course

The Indigenous Pre-Medicine and Health Sciences Enabling Course is designed to provide an alternate pre-entry pathway for Indigenous students into undergraduate courses within the Faculty of Health Sciences including Medicine. The course aims to give students the skills and confidence to pursue higher education in the fields of medicine and health sciences in a culturally appropriate environment.

Indigenous Pre-Business Enabling Course

The Indigenous Pre-Business Enabling Course is provided to support Indigenous Australian students in developing fundamental and significant knowledge and practices in business, commerce, marketing, management, academic writing, communication, and cross-cultural leadership. Successful completion of this course will provide a strong foundation for students to articulate with an ATAR equivalence of 70 into an undergraduate degree in the Faculty of Business and Law.

Indigenous Pre-Science and Engineering Enabling Course

The Indigenous Pre-Science and Engineering Enabling Course is designed to provide Indigenous Australian students the fundamentals of education in the Science and Engineering field with an introduction to Science (STEM) subject areas. Successful completion of this course with an ATAR Equivalence entry score and career pathway counselling, will provide a strong foundation for students to articulate into a Multidisciplinary Science or other nominated undergraduate degree in the Faculty of Science and Engineering.

PORTFOLIO ENTRY INTO SELECTED COURSES

Alternative entry is available for selected courses for those who can demonstrate equivalence to Curtin's ATAR entry through the submission of a portfolio. Applicants are required to provide a complete Portfolio in addition to applying through TISC. Please note that an interview may be required as part of the application process. If you are a school leaver, please prepare your supporting documentation before the end of the school year to ensure you have the required documents. In particular, letters of support can be harder to obtain after the school year has concluded. STEPUP TO CURTIN

Not everyone has the same opportunities to achieve their true academic potential. You may have the ability to succeed at university but have not had the educational, financial or social opportunities to focus on your studies and achieve a high enough Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) for entry. That's where StepUp can help.

StepUp to Curtin is a collaboration of two Alternative Access Schemes, StepUp Entry and StepUp Equity Adjustment Admission Pathway (StepUp Bonus). Both schemes are for school leavers and non-school leavers, and grant an adjustment factor of five additional ATAR points (bonus), making applicants eligible to be considered for admission into Curtin courses.

Successful StepUp Entry and StepUp Equity Adjustment Admission Pathway (StepUp Bonus) applicants will be eligible to be



considered for admission into courses at Curtin University, in courses with no prerequisites or where prerequisite requirements have been met.

StepUp to Curtin is one of many equity initiatives at Curtin that work towards breaking down the barriers to higher education.

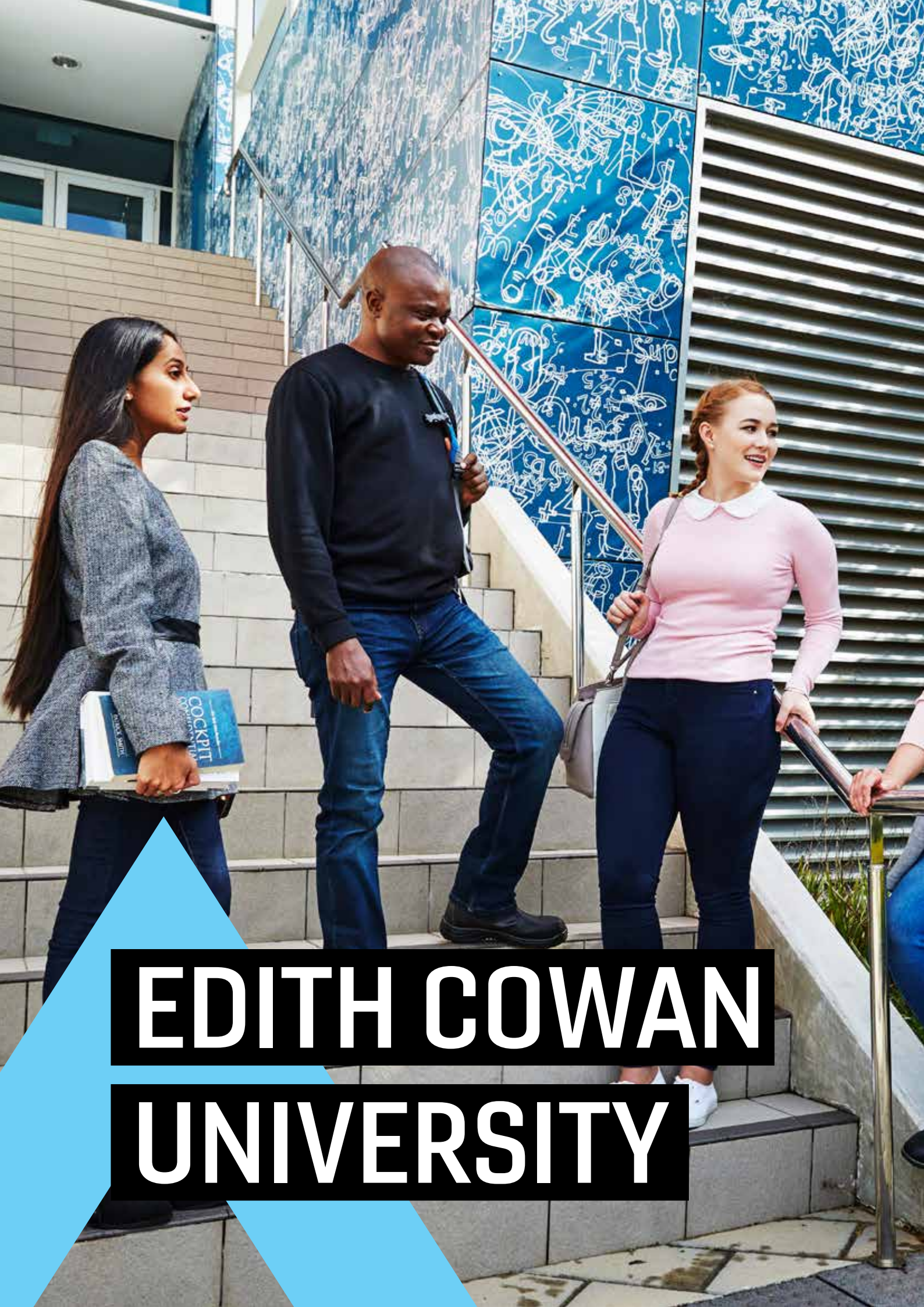

Experience Based Entry Scheme

If your ATAR does not meet the course ATAR requirements, you may be eligible to be considered through the Experience Based Entry Scheme providing you satisfy the following:

- achieved WACE; and
- achieved a minimum final school grade of A in English General or equivalent; and
- met any prerequisites for the course.

To be considered through the Experience Based Entry Scheme, in addition to your TISC application, you'll also need to submit an online application directly to ECU, including uploading your supporting documents for assessment (ecuworlready.com.au/apply).

Applicants without an ATAR

ECU provides other opportunities if you choose not to undertake the traditional tertiary entrance route during your final years of schooling.

If you have completed an ECU-approved Certificate IV from a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) during Year 12 you can be considered for the majority of our undergraduate courses provided you satisfy the following:

- achieved WACE; and
- met minimum English requirements (refer to English Competency Requirements on this page, or refer to TISC's website); and
- met any prerequisites for the course.

Experience Based Entry Scheme

You can submit an Experience Based Entry Scheme application directly to ECU to be considered for an undergraduate course provided you satisfy the following:

- achieved WACE; and
- successfully completed at least 3 ATAR courses and 1 General course; and
- achieved a minimum final school grade of A in English General or equivalent; and
- met any prerequisites for the course.

AUDITIONS, INTERVIEWS AND FOLIO OF WORK

For some courses, satisfactory auditions/ interviews and/or folios of past work are also essential admission requirements. Refer to 'Specific Requirements' within the Course Information on TISC's website, accessed via the Course Search facility.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN ACADEMY OF PERFORMING ARTS (WAAPA) COURSES

As well as attaining minimum admission requirements, entry to WAAPA is also dependent upon an audition and/or interview and/or a folio presentation of previous work and/or practical/theoretical test.

If you've listed any of the following WAAPA course(s) as a preference in your TISC application, you **must also lodge a separate application for your audition/interview directly with ECU by 30 September 2019** (www.ecu.edu.au/future-students/applying):

- Bachelor of Arts (Arts Management);
- Bachelor of Music;
- Bachelor of Education (Secondary) - Music Education;
- Bachelor of Performing Arts - Performance Making.

Auditions and interviews are normally held between October and December. If you've lodged your separate application directly to ECU, you'll be contacted to arrange a specific date and time for your audition/interview.

If you nominate an ECU Music preference and are unsuccessful, you may be considered for an appropriate Diploma or Certificate level course at WAAPA.

Apply directly to ECU (not TISC) for Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma courses at WAAPA in Acting, Dance, Classical Music, Jazz, Production and Design, and Bachelor of Arts degrees in Acting, Dance and Music Theatre. For further enquiries contact futurestudy@ecu.edu.au.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS – ENABLING COURSES

ECU offers three enabling courses:

- University Preparation Course (UniPrep)
- University Preparation Course – Education
- Indigenous University Orientation Course (IUOC) – a specialised admission pathway for Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students.

These enabling programs offer an additional admission pathway to ECU. On completion of the general UniPrep or IUOC, you're eligible to be considered for entry to the majority of undergraduate courses at ECU, dependent on prerequisites, meeting academic requirements and availability.

On completion of the University Preparation Course – Education, you're eligible to be considered for entry to our Bachelor of Education courses, dependent on prerequisites, meeting academic requirements and availability.

ECU will make every effort to offer UniPrep graduates a place in their chosen undergraduate course. However, where the number of eligible applicants is greater than the number of Commonwealth Supported places for the course, offers will be made on a competitive basis.

Australian Citizens, holders of an Australian Permanent Humanitarian Visa, Australian Permanent Residents and New Zealand Citizens are currently eligible to study in a Commonwealth Supported Place, making these courses free, with no up-front or deferred tuition fee. However, note that changes are in the process of being legislated by the Federal Government, and you should check ECU's website for details at www.ecu.edu.au/future-students/fees-and-scholarships.

QUALIFICATIONS FROM A REGISTERED TRAINING ORGANISATION (RTO)

If you've completed an ECU-approved RTO Advanced Diploma, Associate Diploma or Diploma award, you'll be eligible to be considered for entry to the majority of our undergraduate courses.

If you've completed an ECU-approved RTO Certificate IV award, you may be eligible to be considered for entry to the majority of our undergraduate courses, provided you also satisfy the following:

- achieve WACE (school leavers only); **and**

Our Experience Based Entry Scheme assesses your application to ECU based on evidence that includes your qualifications/school results (if applicable), work and life experiences. It allows applicants to be considered for entry to undergraduate courses and caters for:

- School leavers with a near-miss ATAR for their chosen course;
- School leavers who will not/did not obtain an ATAR;
- Other applicants, who may or may not have completed Year 12.

Experience Based Entry Scheme applicants must meet minimum English requirements (refer to English Competency Requirements on page 43 of this Guide, or on TISC's website) or have a minimum of English General with a final school grade of A.

Some courses do not accept applications through the Experience Based Entry Scheme.

As part of your Experience Based Entry Scheme application, you need to include:

- an introductory letter;
- a resume;
- two written references; and
- copies of any certificates, awards or academic records if applicable (school leavers must also submit their most recent school report).

Experience Based Entry Scheme applicants will have their supporting documents assessed against specified criteria including reasons for study and demonstrated preparedness for tertiary level study, and will be admitted to undergraduate level courses based on a competitive process. Eligibility for this admission pathway does not guarantee entry into an ECU course at undergraduate level.

How to apply via Experience Based Entry Scheme

WA School Leavers with an ATAR should apply via TISC and also submit an online application directly to ECU (ecuworldready.com.au/apply). You'll be required to upload your supporting documents to your online application.

Other applicants should apply directly to ECU (ecuworldready.com.au/apply). You'll be required to upload your supporting documents to your online application.

EDUCATIONAL DISADVANTAGE ENTRY

ECU recognises that specific circumstances outside the control of an applicant may occur, which negatively impact on the individual's ability to successfully prepare for entry to university study.

Applicants who have been impacted by one-off or a series of events such as serious medical conditions or bereavements may be considered for entry.

To apply for Educational Disadvantage Entry, you'll need to lodge your application via the relevant method and provide ECU with a statement and supporting documents verifying your claims.

GENERAL INFORMATION

OUR CAMPUSES AND ONLINE STUDY

We have three main campuses in Western Australia, each offering a modern, vibrant location for study and learning. Our campuses have up-to-date facilities including wireless internet, 24-hour access to computer labs, libraries with open study spaces outside office hours and a safe environment for you to study in, either alone or with other students.

JOONDALUP

Our Joondalup Campus is the university's headquarters and has world-class facilities for a range of study areas. We pride ourselves on the industry-relevant facilities that allow students to use modern equipment in a real-world environment, including our purpose-built facilities for Health and Wellness and Engineering. The campus is also home to Ngoolark, a one-stop shop bringing most student-related services under one roof, and Joondalup also has a multi-million-dollar sport and fitness centre, an award-winning



library, an outdoor cinema for the summer months and on-campus accommodation.

The new School of Engineering building at Joondalup Campus significantly increases the School's research capabilities and supports the ongoing development of teaching and research programs. The four-level building includes 2,700 square metres of floor space, with seven state-of-the-art laboratories. The new facility is designed for teaching and research in Chemical, Structural, Geotechnical, Renewable Energy and Petroleum Engineering.

ECU is building a state-of-the-art science building as part of a \$48 million project on our Joondalup campus. 2019 is the International Year of the Periodic Table so, fittingly and in homage to teaching and the scientific industry, the building façade will feature the largest permanent periodic table in the world.

From 2020, students in ECU's School of Science and School of Medical and Health Sciences will benefit from the new facilities, which are scheduled for completion at the end of 2019.

The Joondalup Campus is close to both the Mitchell Freeway and the Joondalup train line, making it easily accessible by car, train, bus and bike. Car and bicycle parking is available on campus.

MOUNT LAWLEY

Our Mount Lawley Campus is only 6km from the Perth CBD and the Beaufort Street cafe strip. It is equipped with extensive teaching resources, and a new communications and arts hub that contains facilities for design, visual arts, fashion, broadcasting, animation, photomedia and film. The campus has a number of cafés and also offers a sport and fitness centre and on-campus accommodation. The campus is also home to

the Western Australian Academy of Performing Arts (WAAPA).

The Mount Lawley Campus is easily accessible by car, bus and bike. Car and bicycle parking is available on campus. Transperth buses link the campus to both the city and the Morley bus station.

BUNBURY (SOUTH WEST)

Located two hours' drive south of Perth, our South West Campus (Bunbury) is within easy reach of the world-famous Margaret River region. The campus is the largest university campus outside the metropolitan area and features modern facilities, small class sizes, a comprehensive range of courses and on-campus accommodation.

The South West Campus (Bunbury) is easily accessible by car and local Bunbury transit services.

ONLINE STUDY

ECU is committed to providing flexible, student-focused learning opportunities. Studying online is a great option if you live in regional WA or interstate, or you have domestic responsibilities or work commitments, making it inconvenient to commute or relocate to study.

Online study is mainly delivered via our learning management system. If you live relatively close to an ECU campus, you'll be able to access campus facilities and learning support services. If not, some support services can still be accessed online.

Online study is available for many courses. Courses can be seen on the TISC website via the 'Course Search' facility or you can refer to Course Codes on pages 21-26.

DEFERRAL OF AN OFFER

If you're offered a place you can apply to defer your offer for up to one year, subject to the course being available in the desired academic period. If deferral is approved, you'll be contacted by ECU and provided information about how to start your studies in later semesters. A place for the same course and campus will only be guaranteed for the following two semesters, subject to availability. For some courses, such as those from WAAPA, you won't be able to defer your offer and will be required to re-apply.

PART-TIME STUDY

Part-time study doesn't necessarily refer to attendance at evening classes. Part-time study involves undertaking a lesser load than the normal full-time load. A normal full-time load is 60 credit points of study per semester, for example four units of 15 credit points each.

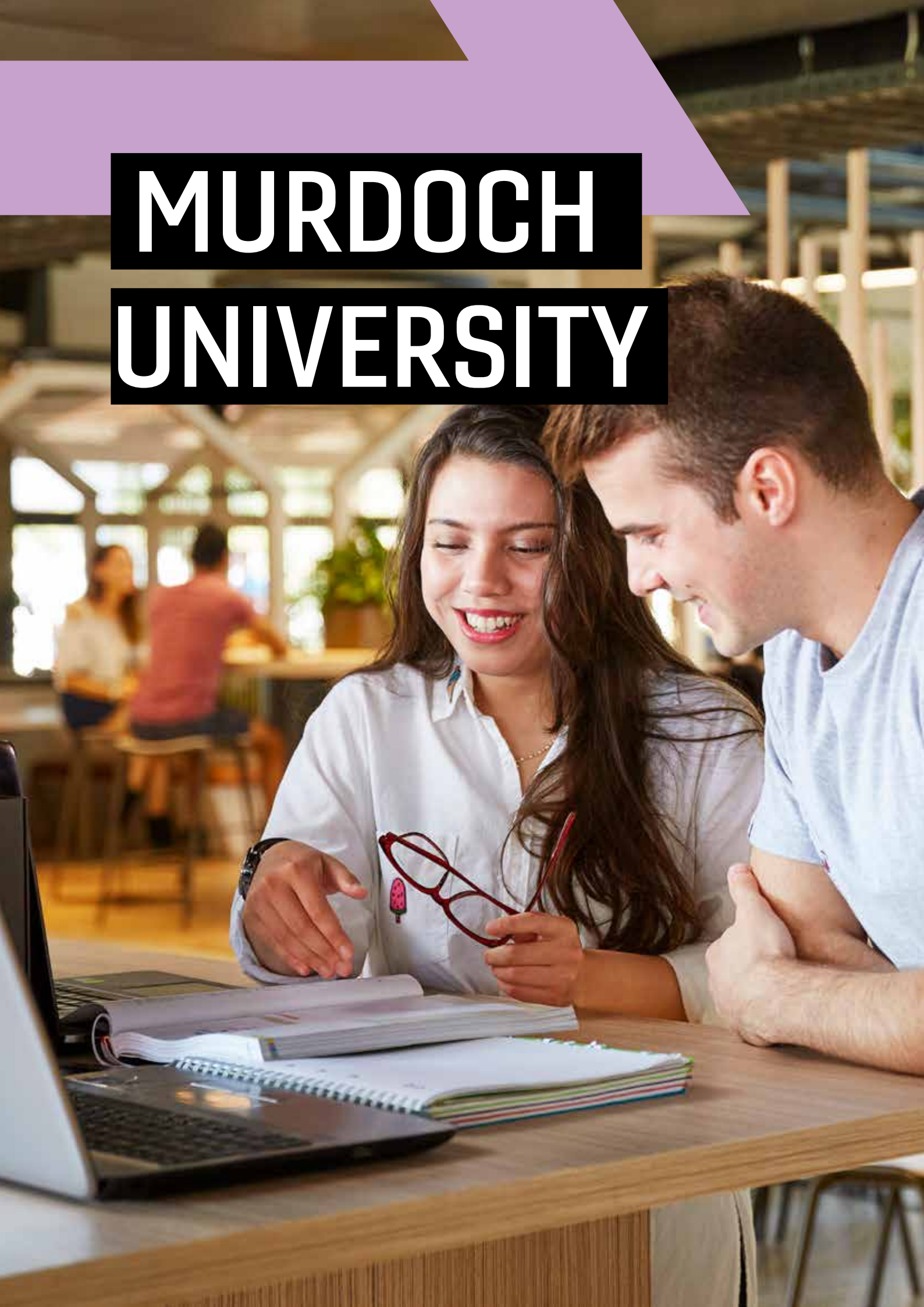

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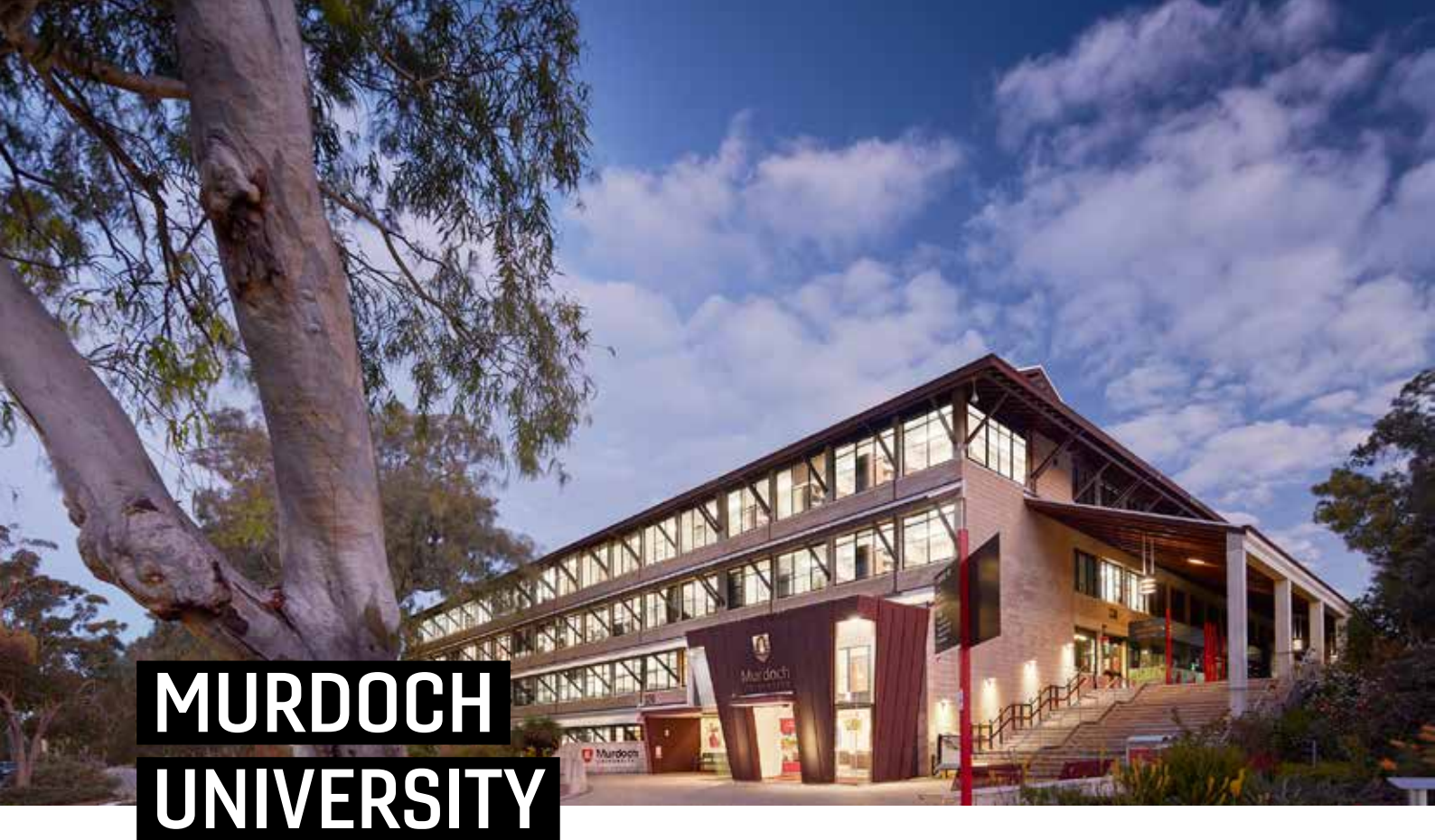

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Universities have many entry pathways, catering for applicants with varying qualifications, such as Year 12 studies, Vocational Education and Training qualifications, tertiary studies, and work and life experience. This Guide focuses primarily on current Year 12 school leaver applicants, but information on all entry pathways can be found both on TISC's website and on university websites.

The University welcomes applications from a variety of educational and life experience backgrounds. The *Admission Requirements for School Leavers* brochure for 2020 entry on TISC's website further outlines the requirements for applicants.

RECENT SECONDARY EDUCATION

The *Admission Requirements for School Leavers* brochure for 2020 entry on TISC's website outlines the requirements for applicants who have recently (within the past two years) completed secondary education at school, TAFE or other VET or higher education providers. Most undergraduate courses at Murdoch have a minimum Selection Rank of 70.00. Your Selection Rank will include your raw ATAR plus any Murdoch RISE adjustment you may be eligible for.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING (VET) STUDY

If you've completed a TAFE Certificate IV, Diploma, or Advanced Diploma, you're eligible to be considered for admission for most of Murdoch's courses. Please visit <https://www.murdoch.edu.au/study> for further details on the level of VET qualification that needs to be completed to meet entry for your course.

Qualifications at Diploma level or higher completed within the last 10 years may make you eligible for some Advanced Standing for your Murdoch degree. Further information on gaining Advanced Standing can be found at <https://www.murdoch.edu.au/study/courses/undergraduate-courses/recognition-of-prior-learning>.

MURDOCH RISE

Murdoch University recognises that not all applicants have the same opportunities to achieve their potential. To support a range of students to achieve admission to undergraduate degrees, Murdoch's RISE will adjust the ATAR of eligible students by up to 10.00 to a maximum Selection Rank of 90.00. Eligibility is determined by WA secondary school codes, WA permanent residence postcode and declared Indigenous status with students needing to meet one of the criteria to be eligible for the adjustment. COMPETENCE IN ENGLISH FOR ADMISSION TO MURDOCH UNIVERSITY

You can demonstrate English proficiency by:

- Achieving a scaled mark of 50 or higher in ATAR English, Literature or English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EALD)
- Sitting an English proficiency test, such as the Special Tertiary Admissions Test
- Successfully completing a university preparation course, English language course (academic) or study at tertiary level

ENABLING COURSES

OnTrack is a 14-week, pre-university, equity-focused program that enables students who don't qualify for entry through other admission pathways to gain entry into Murdoch University. OnTrack provides an opportunity for you to strengthen your academic skills and understanding of university life and study. Following successful completion of OnTrack, you'll be eligible to be offered a place in most undergraduate degree courses at Murdoch University commencing the following semester. You apply for OnTrack through TISC.

FlexiTrack is a free online university enabling course that qualifies you to apply directly for most undergraduate degree courses at Murdoch University that have an indicative ATAR of 70.00. FlexiTrack will give you the tuition you need to boost your academic skills and knowledge to an undergraduate level. You can study intensively over 10 weeks, full-time over 20 weeks, or part-time over 12 months. For more information, visit www.murdoch.edu.au/OnTrack/FlexiTrack/.

Apply directly to Murdoch University for entry into FlexiTrack.

OnTrack Sprint is a four-week intensive program designed to prepare students who have just missed out on the required ATAR for admission to Murdoch University. It provides an admission pathway for students who have completed their WACE Certificate within the previous 18 months, generated a Selection Rank between 60.00 and 69.95 and have met

English competency, or have gained a Selection Rank of 70+ and achieved a scaled ATAR English (or equivalent) score of between 45-50. Applicants must also be Australian Citizens, permanent residents or humanitarian visa holders. Apply directly to Murdoch University for entry into OnTrack Sprint.

Kulbardi Aboriginal Centre. The Kulbardi Aboriginal Centre provides admission pathways to Indigenous people who haven't had an opportunity to complete formal schooling or haven't studied for a number of years. The following courses are available:

- 14-week Indigenous bridging program (K-Track) – apply directly to Murdoch University.
- Professional education program for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders in Veterinary Studies (Waardong Program).

Portfolio Admission Pathway: Admission through the assessment of a portfolio is available at Murdoch University into the Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Communication, and Bachelor of Creative Media for the following majors:

For portfolio admission pathways into the above-mentioned majors, apply through TISC but submit your portfolio online direct to Murdoch University Portfolio entry portal. Please visit portfolio.murdoch.edu.au for information about this admission pathway. Portfolio applicants will also need to demonstrate English competency.

Pre-Law Admission Pathway course provides an entry opportunity for potential students who have the intellectual capacity and diligence to succeed in the Bachelor of Laws (LLB), but do not have recognised prior learning. Students who complete the course at a credit level (60% or above) will be offered direct entry into the Murdoch LLB program. Law Start is a legal aptitude entrance pathway to study Law at Murdoch. This pathway is for students who have excelled at school in one or more ATAR subjects with a strong focus on essay writing and communication skills. Applicants will also need to demonstrate their aptitude to study Law by participation in a workshop and

For this reason, Murdoch University will consider applications from prospective students whose education has been compromised due to genuine hardship, resulting in them falling short of admission requirements for an undergraduate course. GENERAL INFORMATION

SELECTION OF COURSES

When you list a Murdoch course as a preference, for the majority of courses you're also indicating your major area of study. You usually only have the opportunity to select one major unless you apply for one of the combined degrees listed. However, information about adding double majors and minors is available at <https://www.murdoch.edu.au/study/courses/undergraduate-courses/personalise-your-course>.

Some courses are available as combined degrees, which may enable you to graduate with two undergraduate qualifications. Combined degrees have their own course codes, which you can find via the Course Search facility on TISC's website.

PART-TIME STUDY

Most undergraduate classes at Murdoch University are held during normal business hours. Part-time study at Murdoch University doesn't mean attendance at evening classes. If you're a part-time student, you'll enrol in fewer units per semester than full-time students, but attend the same classes in the units in which the full-time students are enrolled.

EXTERNAL STUDY

If a Murdoch University course is listed with a Method of Study of 'E', it means that you can complete the course wholly off-campus (ie you're not required to attend classes on-campus), unless the course information entry for that course indicates an exception. External units use a combination of hard copy and online technology to communicate with you during your enrolment in external units. Where units are available externally, you can enrol in a mix of external and internal units to suit your lifestyle at any particular time.

COURSES WITH LIMITED PLACES

The courses for which entry is expected to be most competitive are Nursing and Veterinary Science. Although certain courses can be added as a second major at initial enrolment, it isn't possible to enrol in some courses unless you've been offered a place in them. However, it will be possible to apply to transfer at the end of the first semester of study.

DEFERRED ADMISSION

If you've been offered a place of study, you can apply to defer admission for up to two

years. A place of study for that same course will only be guaranteed for up to two years from the initial deferral. Deferred students will also be contacted by the Student Centre closer to the time of your preferred intake, therefore it's important that you inform the Student Centre of any change of postal address leading up to that time.

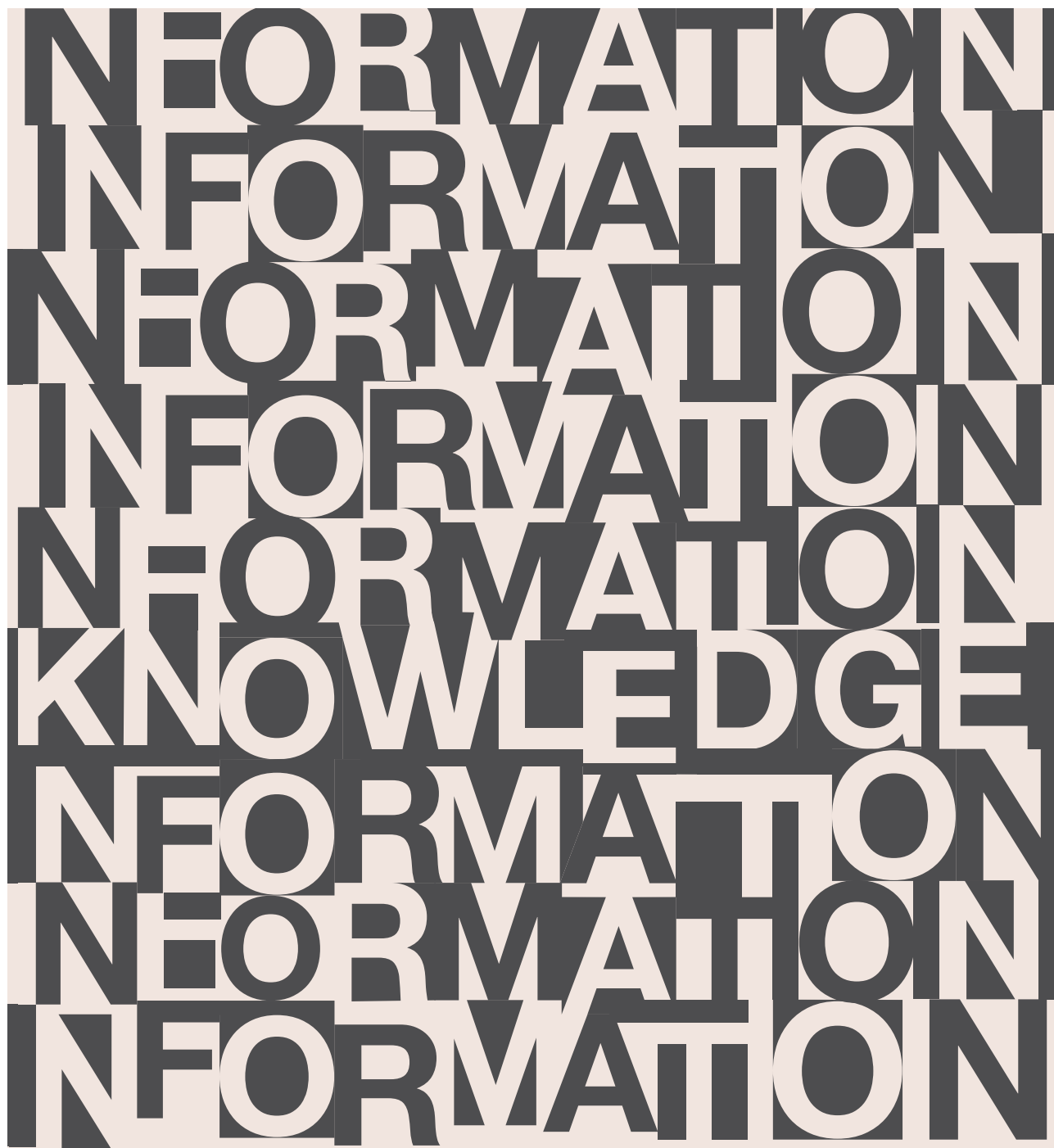
COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACES

If you're an Australian citizen or a New Zealand citizen or an Australian Permanent Resident and are offered a place at Murdoch University, you'll be offered a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP), and if you're an Australian citizen or the holder of an Australian permanent humanitarian visa, you're eligible to access the deferred payment loan scheme (HECS-HELP). If you're currently a Permanent Resident and during your enrolment you become an Australian citizen, you may then access HECS-HELP.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDY (YOUR FIRST DEGREE)

ENGLISH LANGUAGE COMPETENCE

Successful university study requires a certain level of English language skills. Many applicants will be able to demonstrate English language competence through satisfactory performance in the required English subjects at school (final scaled score of 50 or above in an ATAR English subject). If you're unable to demonstrate English language competence in this way, you'll need satisfactory performance in a UWA-approved test of English. A list of approved tests is available at study.uwa.edu.au/elc.

Broadway UWA

The Broadway scheme allows eligible students from Broadway-identified Western Australian schools to receive an automated ATAR adjustment. Eligible students with an ATAR of 75 to 79.95 will receive an adjusted selection rank of 80 to allow them to receive an offer into the Bachelor of Arts, Biomedical Science, Commerce or Science.

Eligible students with an ATAR of 80 or above will also receive a positively adjusted selection rank. If you're an eligible student, you'll be advised of this in your Universities Admission Advice Letter, which you'll see when you check your WACE results at the end of the year.

UWay

Students who have been adversely affected by certain disadvantages can apply for entry through UWay. This applies to Western Australian Certificate of Education (or equivalent qualification) students, including mature-age WACE students or students with previous tertiary study.

Fairway

Fairway UWA is an entry pathway and comprehensive support program for students completing Year 12 under challenging circumstances. The program provides academic, financial and personal support, and it is responsive to individual student needs, throughout their final year of secondary school and during their university studies. Students apply for the Fairway program during Year 11.

UWA First in Family Program

Students who receive an ATAR of 75-79.95 and will be the first in your family to attend university, may still be eligible for a place at UWA.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Applicants

UWA's School of Indigenous Studies offers a Provisional Entry Scheme to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who do not meet the University's entrance requirements. Places are available for undergraduate

courses through the Mature-age Access Program and other pathways, as well as by completing the University's Aboriginal Orientation Course. The Aboriginal Orientation Course is a six- to 12-month bridging course available for applicants who require additional preparation for university studies. PERMANENT RESIDENCY

If you're applying for a Direct Pathway to Medicine or a Direct Pathway to Dental Medicine, you must be granted permanent residency by 30 September 2019 – the closing date for application to these courses. Applicants for all other courses must be granted Australian permanent resident status by 8 January 2020, the final closing date for application for admission through TISC. If you haven't achieved permanent residency by this date, you should apply as an international student for a full-fee place through UWA Admissions.

GUARANTEED ACCOMMODATION OFFER

All new UWA students studying full-time receive a guaranteed accommodation offer to live on campus at a UWA residential college, or off campus. Normal fees and costs apply.
